

HRADEC KRÁLOVÉ REGION



- The number of municipalities: 448
- Largest municipalities: Hradec Králové, Trutnov, Náchod, Jičín, Rychnov nad Kněžnou
- Area: 4,758 square kilometers
- Population: 547 563
- **Population density:** 116 inhabitants per square kilometer
- 20 % of inhabitants live in the region's capital Hradec Králové
- second most visited region in the Czech Republic (visitors from Germany, Poland and Holland)













Regional Assembly

- the most superior body of the region
- consist of 45 members

Regional Council

- the executive body
- consists of 9 members (elected from the Regional Assembly)

Governor of the Region - represents the region

Regional Authority

the institution that executes regional administration (about 370 employees)

INDUSTRY AND AGRICULTURE

The region can be characterized as industrial and agricultural with highly developed services.

There are:

- manufacture and food industries
- branches of clothing, textile and tanning (leather-treating) industries
- car manufacturing and car parts production

60 % of the region consists of agricultural land

- beet-growing (57 %)
- potato-growing (17,5 %)
- mountainous (5,2 %)











CULTURAL LIFE



There are many cultural events organized by non-profit organizations or municipalities, the best known are:

- The European Regions' Theatre Festival in Hradec Králové
- The Jazz Goes to Town Festival in Hradec Králové
- The Battle of Chlum celebration (1866) in Chlum
- The Open Air Rock Festival in Trutnov
- Theatrum Kuks- baroque festival of theatre and music















The area of the region offers many tourist attractions:



Krkonoše Mountains (Giant Mnt.)

- the most visited place in the country with the highest peak of the Czech Republic (Sněžka Mnt. 1602m a.s.l.)

- offers well-equipped ski areas also with indoor facilities



Bohemian Paradise

- the oldest natural wilderness area
- Sandstone rocky towns



ODORLICKO

Orlické Mountains

- offers 50 km long spine along the polish borders

- offers excellent conditions for cross-country skiing and for intermediate down-hill skiers





Jánské Lázně Specialize in: -Water therapy -massage, baths, sauna Capacity 800 beds.








